HOMEAID HELPS HOUSE OF DAWN

Building industry volunteers make improvements at home for young mothers.

JONESBORO, GA – October 8, 2020 – On September 18, HomeAid Atlanta and **Ashton Woods Homes** volunteers held a HomeAid Care Day at House of Dawn's Transitional Housing Program. HomeAid Care Days provide maintenance, upgrades, and repairs for nonprofits that serve people experiencing homelessness in metro Atlanta. **House of Dawn** is a Jonesboro nonprofit organization that provides a stable, loving home and life skills programs for expectant and young mothers at risk for homelessness and abuse.

Ashton Woods volunteers spent the day removing old carpet and prepping for new LVT flooring to be installed, pressure washing two duplexes, landscaping, and exterior painting.

Some of the landscaping work including trimming a large tree with low hanging branches that is now the perfect spot for a tire swing and a relaxing shady space for the young mothers and their children to enjoy. The small group of volunteers made a big impact through their hard work and dedication in the soggy post-rain conditions. This Care Day saved House of Dawn nearly \$3,300.

Ashton Woods is committed to HomeAid Atlanta's mission to build new lives for families and individuals experiencing homelessness in metro Atlanta and nationwide. The company has representatives on the HomeAid America Board of Directors as well as several HomeAid chapters throughout the country. Here in metro Atlanta, Ashton Woods has completed three HomeAid Care Days. This was Ashton Woods second Care Day this year.
