HOMEAID ATLANTA CARE DAYS WITH CALATLANTIC HOMES & PARAN HOMES

HomeAid Atlanta partnered with CalAtlantic Homes (formerly Ryland Homes) for a care day at Phoenix Pass in Conyers, in late April. HomeAid Care Days are one day, hands-on work days powered by volunteers performing repairs and upgrades at Atlanta-area facilities serving homeless families and individuals. Phoenix Pass serves the needs of homeless single mothers and their children by providing an opportunity to re-establish self-sufficiency in a residential setting.



CalAtlantic Homes volunteers installed cabinets, donated by MasterBrand Cabinets, Inc., for HomeAid's new eight-unit apartment building at Phoenix Pass. The CalAtlantic Homes team worked extremely hard during the long, hot work day, saving thousands of dollars in construction costs.

In late May, HomeAid once again partnered with Paran Homes for a Care Day at Shepherd's Rest Ministries, an organization offering services and support to empower abused and homeless women and children, in Dallas. Volunteers worked hard throughout another hot Care Day painting exterior decks, adding mulch to the playground area, and upgrading the home's landscaping.



HomeAid Care Days assist service providers by saving money on repairs and improvements, allowing them to spend donated funds on their resident's services and programs. The HomeAid Care Days, saved the Phoenix Pass project approximately \$5,000 (plus cabinets) and Shepherd's Rest almost \$3,000.
